### **4-H Dog Show Division 1815**

#### General Information

1. Rules in the current Wyoming State Fair Premium book and the 4-H project manual will serve as the official rules for the obedience and showmanship contests. You are responsible for knowing and complying with those rules.
2. "A" Classes are for dogs that have not had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC Competitions or do not have an Obedience or Rally Title in AKC Competitions. "B" classes are for dogs that have had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC competitions or that do have an obedience or Rally Title in AKC Competitions.
3. To enter agility, you must have entered obedience or showmanship.
4. Health certificates and vaccination records must be presented at the pre-show check-in beginning at 7AM.
5. Dogs must be on leash at all times and are confined to the area of the dog show and staging area. Do not enter the activities building or livestock barns.
6. Dogs are released following the show.
7. Showmanship classes will be grouped by age group, no individual showmanship.

#### 4-H Dog Show

##### Obedience and Showmanship Rules

1. A 4-H member may compete in only one obedience class per dog. If there is more than 1 dog, then each dog shall be referred to as "A" and thereafter for class entries.
2. The first year beginner novice class is for members who are in their first year of the dog project, not the first year with a new dog. It is designed as a training class for members who do not feel competent to start in On Leash classes. Members may compete in the first year beginner novice class only once.
3. A 4-H Exhibitor with a dog shown previously in obedience classes by another 4-H member, or a dog that has a title from another organization or has three qualifying scores from the designated annual county 4-H show, must show the dog by these guidelines:
  - a. Junior and Intermediate age exhibitors may move back or down one level.
  - b. Senior age exhibitors must show the dog at the highest level the dog has achieved.
4. A dog receiving a qualifying score of at least 170 points at the designated annual county 4-H show may advance after receiving 3 qualifying scores from the designated annual 4-H show. Once the higher level of obedience is selected for the dog, the member may not drop back/down to the lower level with the same dog.

##### Score Sheets

1. The Wyoming 4-H Dog score sheets were designed for the benefit of 4-H members. They are intended as guides for judges. Judges use their discretion in deciding the seriousness of errors.

## Competition Guidelines

1. All dogs must enter/leave the show ring and compete with a leash, dependent on class rules.
2. Bait and/or toys are not allowed in obedience competition.
3. Dogs soiling or urinating in the ring during judging will be disqualified and receive no score.
4. Males and females will be shown in the same class. Females in heat will be shown last in the class and must be kept away from the obedience ring until call time.
5. An identification paper must have been filed with the extension office by May 1st.
6. Governing rules shall be from the Wyoming State 4-H Dog Show Guidelines, not AKC Guidelines. Classes will run in book order unless exhibitors are notified prior to the show.
7. 4-H members in the dog project may use co-owned or leased dogs. The member must have responsibility for the sole care, training and showing of that dog for the current 4-H year and in the case of a co-owned dog, there must be a training contract.
8. Dogs must have current immunizations including: Rabies, Distemper, and Parvo.
9. Rabies vaccinations must be renewed under state guidelines. Dogs must be accompanied by an official health certificate by a veterinarian to participate at Albany County Fair.
10. Dogs may only be taken into the Livestock Show Arena or Swine Barn for Staging.
11. Be prepared to clean up after your dog while on the fairgrounds.
12. Vicious dogs will be dismissed from the ring and must be immediately removed from the fairgrounds.
13. An exhibitor must show with a six foot (6') leash unless otherwise determined by event regulations.

## 4-H Dog Obedience

### Class

1. First Year Beginner Novice
2. On Leash A
3. Novice A (on and off leash) - for dogs that have not received a first level obedience title from a 4-H sponsored event or another organization.
4. Graduate Novice A - for dogs that have received a first level obedience title but have not received a second.
5. Open A (off leash) - for dogs that have received a first level obedience title but have not received a second level title.
6. Utility A (off leash) - for dogs that have received a second level obedience title.
7. On Leash B
8. Novice B (on and off leash) - For dogs that have not received a first level obedience title.
9. Graduate Novice B - for dogs that have received a first level obedience title but have not received a second level obedience title.
10. Open B (off leash) - for dogs that have received a first level obedience title but have not received a second level obedience title.
11. Utility B (off leash) - For dogs that have received a second level obedience title.

## 4-H Dog Conformation

1. Classes will be subdivided by breed within a class, if number warrant. First place winners will compete for Best in Show Conformation trophy.
2. Exhibitors entering more than one dog in any class may be assisted only by another 4-H member, if the dogs must be shown at the same time.
3. Classes 12-19 will be judged according to AKC Standards, but it is not necessary that dogs be registered. They must be purebred; both mother and father of same breed.
4. Classes 20 & 21 will be judged according to the predominant breed characteristics and/or soundness, gait, condition and grooming.
5. Before entering your dog, check the list of breeds that are eligible for each group. It can be found online at <http://www.Wyoming4-H.org> under the dog project.

#### 4-H Dog Agility

1. Agility classes are open only to members enrolled in the dog project in Albany County. Entry in agility is required to accompany participation in one additional area of the dog project.
2. Before competing in agility the team of dog and handler must have received instruction in agility procedures. It is mandatory that the team participate in one year of obedience concurrent or prior to instruction in agility.
3. Dogs must be one year of age by May 1st.
4. Obstacle contact familiarization for handler and dogs on levels 1, 2, and 3 will be held before competing. A separate course of familiarization for handler only will be held, not to exceed 10 minutes for each level.
5. Bait may not be used in competition.
6. Dogs in heat will run at the end of the class. We discourage competing with very pregnant dogs.
7. You must use a flat, buckle collar with nothing hanging from it. Leashes, if allowed, can be up to six feet in length or one-half foot tab or fob.
8. State entrants must achieve qualifying scores at their county level before competing in the state 4-H dog show. The level at which a member qualifies at the county is the level in which they will compete at the State 4-H Dog Show.
9. A dog receiving a qualifying score of at least 75 points at the county 4-H Show may advance the following year to the next higher class but must advance after receiving 3 qualified scores from the designated county show. Once the higher level in agility is selected for the dog, the member may not drop back to the lower level with the same dog.
10. Youth, with a dog shown in previous years by a different member, or a dog that has a standard agility title from another organization or has received 3 qualifying scores from the designated annual county 4-H show must show the dog under those guidelines.
11. Junior and Intermediate aged 4-H youth may move back/down one level.
12. Senior aged 4-H youth must show the dog at the highest level the dog has qualified.
13. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.
14. Level 1 dogs will run on leash. Level 2 dogs must run off leash or with a tab no longer than 6". Collars must be flat, buckle variety with nothing hanging from it such as tags.
15. A time for all handlers to familiarize themselves with the course they are competing in will be established and announced.
16. To qualify for agility competition, the handler must compete in obedience or showmanship classes at fair.
17. Same day advancement to another level is not allowed. However, Junior and Intermediate members with a dog shown previously by another member of AKC agility show champion may move back/down one level. A senior member with the same dog, must show at the last level in which the dog competed.

- Level 1: Six obstacles. Dog walk, single bar jump, wall jump, broad jump, open tunnel, pause table. On or off leash, no penalty for touching dog or obstacles, Qualifying score is 150; time allowed: 1:30.
  - Level 2: Nine obstacles. All six from level 1 plus A Frame, tire jump, and closed tunnel. Qualifying score is 150; time allowed: 2:00
  - Level 3: All of level 1 & 2 obstacles plus double bar and/or seesaw. Off leash, collar optional. Qualifying score is 175; time allowed: 2:00.
  - Level 4: 12 obstacles, all of level 3 plus 6 weave poles. Off leash, collar optional. Qualifying score is 175; time allowed: 2:00.
  - Level 5: 14-15 obstacles, all of level 4 plus 12 weave poles. Off leash, collar optional. Qualifying score 185; time allowed: 2:00.
  - Level 6: includes all of level 5 obstacles, may be included multiple times. Off leash, collar optional. Course consists of two runs. 1st run, standard level 5. Second run, jumps with weaves. Times and scores will be combined for placing.
18. Fastest times will be used to break ties on scores at all levels.
  19. Check in for agility classes, present health certificate and vaccination records when dog is measured.
  20. State dog agility rules will be followed.

#### 4-H Dog Rally Rules

1. Youth can enter a single dog in only one rally class.
2. "A" classes are for dogs that have not had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC competitions or that do not have an Obedience or Rally title in AKC competitions.
3. "B" Classes are for dogs that have had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC competitions or that do have an Obedience or Rally Title in AKC Competitions.
4. Dogs soiling in the ring will be disqualified.
5. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.
6. Those competing on leash should do so with a 6' leash.
7. Collars may be flat buckle (nylon or leather) type or choke chains.
8. No bait (dog treats or toys) are allowed in the ring.
9. See the 4-H dog show guidelines for specifics, explanations, and references.

#### 4-H Dog Rally Definitions

1. Junior, Intermediate, and Senior is the 4-H age of the youth.
2. Rookie - a youth who is competing for the first time.
3. Veteran - a youth who has competed before and is in his/her second year or more of competing.
4. Novice - a dog which is competing for the first time or which has not obtained a qualifying score to achieve advanced status.
5. Advanced - a dog which has been used for competition before and received a score of at least 70 points in a novice class.
6. Excellent - a dog which has been used for competition before and received a score of at least 70 points in an advanced class.

#### 4-H Cake Decorating Division 1819

1. Open only to members enrolled in the cake decorating project.
2. Decorating must be done on an artificial cake form. Do not exhibit real cakes.
3. Place exhibits on disposable cake boards covered with foil, plastic or decorative covering and allow 1" minimum for free space between cake and outer board.
4. No glass plates or valued trays. We are not responsible for broken or missing trays.
5. Frosting should make a good base for decorations.
6. Design should be suitable for the size and shape of the cake. It should show good use of color and a pleasing combination of decorations.
7. Posters should be limited to 22" x 28" with a small hole in the top center for hanging.
8. All exhibits that are not claimed by Sunday are subject to disposal by fair staff.
