Prepared Foods

1. Recipes are required for all entrees. Recipes can be handwritten, photo copies, or printed. Recipes should be on note cards no bigger than 4"x6". The recipe must include the member's name and age. Recipes will be available to pick up at the end of the fair when exhibits are released.
2. No mixes allowed.
3. Exhibits should be entered using a disposable pan or plate and covered with clear plastic or a clear self-sealing bag.

4. Ingredients: Any ingredient that the 4-H'er uses must be able to be purchased by the 4-H'er. Ingredients such as beer, whiskey, rum, etc. may NOT be used in any recipe file or food exhibit. Exhibits that include alcohol will be disqualified.
5. Food Safety: Exhibits are on display for several days. Please think about FOOD SAFETY! Items that require refrigeration will not be accepted, judged, or displayed as exhibits must be safe to eat when entered, whether they are tasted or not. Glazes, frostings and other sugar-based toppings are considered safe due to their high sugar content. Egg glazes on yeast breads and pie crusts BEFORE baking are acceptable. Eggs incorporated into baked goods and crusts are considered safe. The following food ingredients are considered unsafe for fair exhibits and will be disqualified:
 - Egg or cream fillings and cream cheese frostings
 - Any meat item including meat jerky, imitation meat bits (bacon bits, pepperoni, etc.)
 - Melted cheese on top of food exhibit (cheese mixed into baked goods is considered safe and will be accepted)
 - Uncooked fruit toppings (i.e., fresh fruit tart).
6. Smaller baked items (rolls, cookies, biscuits, muffins, scones etc.) place 3 items for each entree.
7. Large baked items (cakes, loaves etc.) enter ¼ of the item. Breads will be displayed as an end-cut, cut from top crust to bottom.
8. Candy any recipe, 3 pieces of candy on a paper plate or ½ cup. No items containing cream cheese will be accepted (Example: cream cheese mints). Candy may be cooked or no cook; dipped, molded, made in the microwave or other methods of candy preparation.

Food & Nutrition – Educational Display (Added class for members who are learning beyond baking, but displaying learning not safe due to ingredients)

- An educational exhibit (poster, report, display) that shows skills or learning about cooking, baking, eating and choosing healthy foods, meal planning & service, safety practices, or food preservation. Exhibits showing learning about meal planning & service must include menu.
8. The use of alcoholic beverages in the preparation or production of 4-H food exhibits is NOT permitted.

Food Preservation

1. All foods must have been prepared since the last State Fair.
2. All 4-H members enrolled in foods can participate.
3. Each entry needs to be a different product. I.e: entry 1- Salsa. Entry 2- jam, entry 3- green beans. There are not different classes, just one entry for each item.
4. All canned food must have a label with the following information:
 - Name of product
 - Date preserved
 - Method of preservation (pressure canner, water bath canner or dried)
 - Type of pack (raw pack or hot pack)
 - Altitude (and altitude adjustment, if needed)
 - Processing time
 - Number of pounds of pressure (if pressure canner used)
 - Drying method and drying time (for dried food exhibits)
 - Recipe and source of recipe (if a publication, include name and date)
5. Current USDA guidelines for food preservation methods MUST be followed. Suggested sources of recipes include:
 - 4-H Food Preservation Manuals (Freezing, Drying, Boiling Water Bath Canning, Pressure Canning)
 - USDA Guide to Home Canning

6. Current USDA processing methods and altitude adjustments must be followed for all food preservation. Jam, preserves and marmalades, fruit, tomatoes and pickled products must be processed in a boiling water bath. Tomatoes may be processed in a pressure canner. All non-acid vegetables and meats must be processed in a pressure canner. Improperly canned or potentially hazardous food items will be disqualified. Spoiled or unsealed container disqualifies entry.
7. Standard canning jars (half-pint, pint, quart) must be used for all canned exhibits. (The brand name, such as Ball or Kerr, imprinted on the side of the jar identifies a standard jar) All jars must have two piece metal canning lids (flat and band) Re-usable lids and one piece lids are not allowed. Decorative storage containers which have a rubber seal are not acceptable for canning exhibits.
8. All canned goods will be exhibited without rings. Transport canned goods with rings on, remove them at the fair and keep rings with you. Rings must be removed for judging

Food Preservation

9. All entries will be judged based on meeting food safety guidelines from USDA and current UW publications. i.e: head space, uniformity of product, and clearness of liquid.
 - Preserved foods will not be opened at the fair for tasting by the judge unless a tie breaker is needed. If jars are opened, the exhibitor will be notified and entree will be placed in a refrigerator. Exhibitors can replace them for exhibit at the State Fair.
 - More than one item can be entered per class, if the entries display different skills learned.
